A BILL

For

An act to establish a punishment for the harboring and employment of illegal aliens

Section 1: Be it enacted that a penalty be imposed upon any business or proprietor that harbors or employs illegal aliens in the state of Wyoming. This penalty shall consist of two punishments, to be prescribed by a judge if the accused is convicted.

A. For a first offense:

- a. A monetary fine not to exceed fifty thousand pesos (50,000)
- b. Incarceration for a period not to exceed 90 days

B. For all subsequent offenses

- a. A monetary fine not to exceed one hundred thousand pesos (100,000)
- b. Incarceration for a period not to exceed one hundred and eighty (180) days

Section 2. Definitions:

- A. A business shall be defined as any establishment or enterprise that is a commercial entity designed to make a product or provide a service.
- B. A proprietor shall be defined as the owner and/or operator of a the business
- C. Illegal aliens shall be defined as expatriate citizens of any foreign nation or power who did not possess United States Citizenship at the time of their employment in the State of Wyoming.
- D. Employment shall be defined as any work done in exchange for compensation, whether monetary or otherwise

Section 3. Immigration authorities and investigative services under the bounds and auspices of the State of Wyoming shall enforce this Bill.

Section 4. The bill requires no additional funding beyond that which has already been appropriated to the aforementioned entities. However, if additional funding becomes necessary it will be appropriated during the next state budgeting session.

Section 5. This shall go into effect one hundred and eighty (180) days from it's date of passage.
